The conference series has been initiated by the <u>International Society for Applied Biological Sciences</u> established to promote, develop and advance applied biological sciences, particularly in clinical medicine, molecular genetics, forensic sciences and biotechnology. Since its establishment, the ISABS Conference has attracted more than 7,000 participants and 861 lecturers, including ten Nobel Laureates, from over 85 countries.
