2		3.22	E	The definition mentions the "National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform." It looks like part of the name has been cut off. Similarly, the note below begins with "NOTE State Laws (NCCUSL)" and may be missing the first part of the name.	If the name has indeed been cut off, add in the missing pieces. The note also needs something to complete the sentence, e.g., "X *operates* in the United States with the intention of harmonizing state laws between the states."
