The presenters will specifically discuss their analysis of the Al-Qaeda training manual, their review of the open source literature, and their experiences working counterterrorism investigations. The presenters will also discuss the life course of the AlQaeda operator, from recruitment, through training, to deployment, and ultimately, to the attack. Finally, the presenters will discuss issues involving Al-Qaeda operators' motivation, organization of thinking, progression from idea conception to attack, and violence risk assessment.
