

I11 Insanity Acquitees and Their Victims

After attending this presentation, attendees will understand the diag- nostic and demographic characteristics of insanity acquitees; understand the method of violence most commonly used by insanity acquitees; and understand the common relationships between the insanity acquitee and their victims.

This presentation will impact the forensic community and/or humanity by assisting the forensic community's conception of character- istics of individuals that have met the legal criteria of Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity.

Insanity acquittees are a very specialized subset of violent offenders, and this research attempts to identify the diagnostic, demographic and behavioral differences between insanity acquittees and the large popu- lation of violent offenders. The literature on this topic is reviewed, and data from a New York State Forensic Hospital is presented.
